Our new strategy will help us to improve care for patients, and improve the working lives of our 9,000 staff.

Our new strategy will also help guide the decisions we make, and the areas we have chosen to invest in and develop.

Of course, our priority is to provide the best care possible for our patients, and our new strategy does not change this.

It will, however, give everyone connected with the Trust – including patients, staff, communities and those we work with – a better understanding of what we want to achieve in the future.

#### How we will monitor the progress we are making

We have already started work to make the priorities set out in this strategy a reality for our staff and patients.

This includes specific initiatives such as:

- improving our outpatient services
- increasing access to same day emergency care
- working with other hospitals in our region to tackle staff shortages in particular specialties.

Our new strategy was published on 23 April 2019 and the decisions we make in the future will be linked to the four priorities set out in this summary.

There will also be a number of supporting strategies in place, based on the priorities set out in this document. Those strategies will be essential for tackling the financial, operational and quality challenges we face. The supporting strategies relate to the quality of our services, our hospital buildings, digital technology, clinical research and workforce.

We will continue to listen to patient and staff opinions about our strategy through existing forums and meetings, so that the strategy becomes a vital part of decision-making and providing services.

We will also clearly communicate the progress we are making, and make sure that our successes and challenges are shared and widely publicised.

#### How we developed our strategy

We've been talking to hundreds of staff members and patients to help us develop our new strategy.

This strategy has been shaped by our staff, patients and local communities – with more than 500 people attending 26 events over the past year.

We've also held meetings with local GPs, patient groups, trade unions and clinical and management teams at the Trust.

This period of listening to different people has been vital. We've heard people's honest views about us and the services we provide, including what we do well and where we need to improve.

Despite the challenges of recent years, everyone at St George's has the desire to succeed and achieve great things.

Your support is a vital part of our success, and the priorities set out in our strategy have been shaped by you.

You've helped us create a strategy that builds on our strengths and the progress we have made, while also setting out a plan for the next five years.
