

Referral to the Paediatric Trauma Clinic

This leaflet explains more about your child's referral to the paediatric trauma clinic at St George's Hospital for his/her recent injury to be examined.

If you have any further questions, please speak to a doctor or nurse caring for your child.

What is the paediatric trauma clinic?

This is a clinic run by a paediatric plastic surgery consultant and their team to help treat your child. The clinic can be very busy. We will try not to keep you waiting too long, but it is possible you may have to wait over an hour at busy times.

Where is the clinic held?

The paediatric trauma clinic is held in the Dragon Centre, Lanesborough wing, St George's Hospital. The main entrance to the Dragon Centre is on the Perimeter road.

Who will see my child?

If your child has a dressing they will be seen first by the dressing clinic nurse to have it removed. A doctor will then see your child to check the wound or injury and to discuss treatment with you.

If your child needs another dressing, the nurse will put this on before you leave. Your child may also need to be seen by a specialist hand therapist. This will be done in clinic, all at the same appointment.

Will there be further follow up?

Depending on your child's injury, they may be given another appointment to see the doctor or may have a follow up with a hand therapist or nurse in the dressing clinic at St George's Hospital.

Sometimes follow up can be with your GP or practice nurse, in which case we will ask you to make an appointment at your GP surgery.
