

Fetal Growth and Your Baby

Congratulations on your pregnancy. This is a time of happiness but can also worry parents. The vast majority of babies will grow normally, but some may need further monitoring.

Low risk

You have a singleton pregnancy with:

- A low risk early pregnancy screening result (less than 2%) for preterm pre-eclampsia and fetal growth restriction, or
- Normal uterine artery Doppler at the anomaly scan

If you meet these criteria then you will have:

- A routine anomaly scan at 20-22 weeks
- A routine growth scan at 36-37 weeks
- A low risk sticker placed in your notes

Please note that depending on events in your pregnancy, we may sometimes change the care pathway for your pregnancy. This will be addressed by your Obstetrician, Midwife or Sonographer.
