
Advice for patients feeling unwell who may be neutropenic or who are immunosuppressed

These patients include

- Patients on current anti-cancer therapy or chemotherapy
- Patients who have had a recent bone marrow transplant (within the last 12 months)
- Patients who have had a bone marrow transplant and are on immunosuppressive medication, e.g. ciclosporin
- Patients who have been warned by their haematology team to attend hospital urgently if they develop a fever >38°C or feel unwell.
