Achievements:	The TPD for the Pan Thames Training Programme remains based at St. George's and manages all the London trainees at the 4 london centres – SGUH, GOSH, GSTT, LNWH
	We successfully applied for and received one of 12 national 'expansion' posts bringing our Clinical Genetics NTNs up to 5 (50% HEE funded, 50% trust funded)
	1 st FY2 rotation to Clinical Genetics in the trust has started in Aug 2023. Successful so far and a complimentary year with a rotation in Paediatrics and Psychiatry
	GMC survey positive for St. George's Clinical Genetics training with an increased number of trainees from other training centres wishing to rotate here for their secondment year
	All consultants within the department have up to date SUMMIT or equivalent and are accredited medical educators.
	Have submitted an application for a ACF – yet to hear outcome.
Issues:	Office space, Estates infrastructure, Secretarial and admin support, Clinic space for SpRs alongside consultant clinics Genomics laboratory hub based at GSTT
	These all remain challenging and is the reason that one of our excellent trainees who CCTd this year took a consultant post at GOSH instead of at St. George's after successfully interviewing for a post at both trusts. We have a great reputation and train excellent clinical geneticists and it is such a great shame if we can't hang on to them.
Plans for next quarter:	Continue to develop the timetable for trainees including cancer blocks, rare disease, specialty to ensure adherence to the new curriculum. Develop regular teaching opportunities for clinical genetics trainees



perhaps for other specialties to help embed genomics into the trust through the junior docs.
