Achievements:	 Return to in-person clinical attachment at Wolfson Rehabilitation Centre: Onsite medical student teaching over day 1. Hybrid lecture on day 2. Benefits – direct experience of MDT working, chance to interact and work with diverse patient group, concepts withing rehab enhanced by experiental learning. Review and re-alignment of programme with curriculum and current developments in rehabilitation. Introduction of reflective practice session into block. Collection of block specific feedback.
Issues:	 Student IT Access Frequently nil smart cards to access iclip/expired iclip logins. Limited IT facilities for students on QMH site. Recruitment to Student teaching coordinator role: Recruitment in to unfilled post now complete – period of 4 months without cover. Access to CANVAS resource: Both Dr Hayes and Med student coordinator still awaiting CANVAS access. Obtaining honorary contracts for staff: Awaiting honorary contract for teaching coordinator.
Plans for next quarter:	Pertaining to current academic quarter/year: Obtain IT resources – computers currently on order. Proactively obtain IT access for students (via neuroblock coordinator). Collate feedback on return to in-person teaching – review on per block basis – aiming to improve student experience during academic year (without changes to taught material/teaching delivery). Develop PDP teaching coordinator and explore ties with faculty at SGUL/potential development opportunities.



 Pertaining to academic year 2024/2025: Review of e-learning resources on CANVAS to update and refresh. Integration of services currently under development in to
 student sessions (e.g upper limb robotics). Review CPD and development opportunities with SGUL.
